

DHYE DREAMS directed by Shanta Nepali

English, 27 min, nonfiction, winner of the short film competition organised by the EUDEL Nepal in April 2024

"Dhye Dreams" is a 30-minute documentary that intimately explores the lives of three women fighting against their fate: Sonam Sangmo, Kunchok Dolkar, and Lhakpa Choezon. Most villagers have moved down to a river-fed valley and the new frontier town of Chambaleh, where they hope to grow a commercial apple crop. But Kunchok and Lhakpa stay with their beloved livestock and fields up in the mountains. Their stories highlight the resilience and struggle for the survival of isolated Himalayan villages battling against dramatic climate change.

Nepali with English subtitles, 14 min, winner of the short film competition organised by the EUDEL Nepal in April 2024

In the midst of social divides, 'The Bull, The Cow, and The Calf' reveals the toll of family conflict on children. As financial tensions rise between parents, their son quietly observes their arguments. Trapped between their struggles and a desire for peace, the boy confronts the loss of innocence in their turbulent home.

A poetic picturisation of the struggle and courage of a Nepali woman.

INTO THE MIST directed by Dr. Sachin Ghimire & Gaurab KC Nepali with English subtitles, 78 min, nonfiction

This is a biopic based on the life and work of leading Nepali anthropologist Dor Bahadur Bista. Professor Bista is remembered to this day for institutionalising anthropology and sociology in Nepal. Highly regarded and considered by some as a somewhat controversial figure, he suddenly disappeared one day, and no one knows what happened to him. This film explores his disappearance as well as his legacy.

13:25 - 15:05: BULAKI directed by Laxman Sunar Nepali with English subtitles, 105 min, fiction

A story based on a practice called "Jari," prevalent in some parts of Nepal (whereby a man who married the wife of another man has to pay compensation to the latter in form of cash and in kind), and its implications for two families, set against the remoteness and hardship of a far-flung region in Nepal.

15:25 - 16:45: AJIMA AND 6 GENDERS directed by Sunil Babu PantaNepali with English subtitles, 80 min, nonfiction

The documentary delves into Kathmandu's matriarchal history, focusing on the Ajima goddesses, and the complex relationship between patriarchal and matriarchal values. The film explores diverse genders and sexualities, and presents a profound reflection on cultural heritage and modern gender issues.

DAY 3 - 4 DECEMBER 2024



9:15 - 10:45: BLACK HEN directed by Min Bham Nepali with English subtitles, 80 min, fiction

The film is based on a journey embarked by two friends, Prakash and Kiran, belonging to different castes in search of a missing hen, unaware of the tyranny brought by the fragile ceasefire during the Nepalese civil war.

A story about a woman who drives a tempo (3-wheeled micro-bus service). The film touches on topics of couples separated because one person leaves to work abroad, and life for the person who stays behind, among many other themes.

13:45 - 15:30: BUTTERFLY ON A WINDOW PANE directed by Sujit BidariNepali with English subtitles, 96 min, fiction

As the studious Bidhya (13) prepares for her further studies, her juvenile brother Basanta (9) keeps distracting her with his antics. But when he learns that his sister is giving up on her dreams, Basanta struggles to give Bidhya the hope and inspiration she desperately needs.
