COMBATING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS: FROM WORDS TO ACTION Side Event – Brussels VI Conference 5 May 2022 – 11:30 am to 2 pm

In preparation of Brussels VI Conference "Supporting the future of Syria and the region" on 9-10 May 2022, EuroMed Feminist Initiative and Syria Gender Advocacy Group would like to invite you to a panel discussion on "Combating Violence Against Women and Girls: From Words to Action"

Although women carry heavy burdens in war, only 2 percent of post-conflict budgets target women's empowerment or gender equality. Women are often excluded from the negotiation tables. In Syria, violence against women and girls (VAWG) is systematically practiced and cannot be separated from the Syrian context. It has been identified as a major barrier to women's participation at all levels in the *Common Agenda for Combating Violence against Women and Girls in Syria*, developed through a one-year consultation process with more than 250 Syrian activists, gender, and legal experts from over 100 organisations and initiatives.

This panel which consists of Syrian women's rights activists from the Syria Gender Advocacy Group promoting the implementation of *Common Agenda* will discuss the proposed actions to address the identified challenges, one of which is lack of sufficient dedicated funds and support to Syrian women's organisations and initiatives to combat VAWG as a main barrier to women's participation at all levels.
